B&O BICYCLE TOUR AT LUCAS OIL RACEWAY

The 26th annual B&O Bicycle Tour showcases five miles of the B&O Trail as well as scenic countryside. You can choose from 10 -, 25-, 45-, or 62-mile loops. After the ride, stick around for lunch and live music. Music is sponsored by Duke Energy. After the ride, enjoy watching junior drag racing on the world famous Lucas Oil Raceway drag strip.

WHERE - NEW LOCATION THIS YEAR!

The ride will begin and end at Lucas Oil Raceway, 10267 E US-136, Indianapolis, Indiana. DO NOT ENTER THE MAIN ENTRANCE ON US-136. ENTER GATE 3 FROM CR300N approaching from the east.

From I-465, take US-136 (Crawfordsville Road) 3.0 miles west through Clermont to Raceway Road. Turn left on Raceway Road. Go 0.7 mile and turn right onto CR300N. Go 0.9 miles on 300N and enter Lucas Oil Raceway through Gate 3.

From I-74, take Ronald Reagan Pkwy south 0.6 mile to Connector Road. From Connector Road, turn left onto US-136 and go 1.6 miles to Raceway Road, passing 1000E and the main entrance to Lucas Oil Raceway. Turn right onto Raceway Road. Go 0.7 mile and turn right onto CR300N. Go 0.9 mile on 300N and enter Lucas Oil Raceway through Gate 3.

From the south, take Ronald Reagan Pkwy to 200N. Turn right on 200N and go 1.1 miles to Raceway Road. Turn left onto Raceway Road and go 1.0 mile to 300N. Turn left onto 300N, go 0.9 mile and enter Lucas Oil Raceway through Gate 3.

START TIME

Sign-in begins at 7:00 a.m. on Saturday, June 2, 2018. The 45- and 62-mile riders will depart at 8:30; the 25-mile riders at 8:45; the 10-mile riders at 9:00.

WHO

Whether you're a family of beginners, an experienced touring cyclist, or a club rider, the B&O Bicycle Tour is for you. It's not a race.

WHAT'S FOR LUNCH

Listen to live music as you enjoy a fantastic BBQ lunch catered by Pit Stop Barbecue and Grill restaurant immediately after the ride. Finish off your lunch with a frozen treat from Schwann's Frozen Foods, free to all participants. Thank you to Aqua Systems for donating water and Piazza Produce for the fruit.

SEE YOURSELF ON INSTAGRAM

During the ride, take pictures and post them on Instagram, #bobikeride. We will show the pictures on a continuous loop throughout the day back at the Lucas Oil Pavillion. You can enjoy them as you eat lunch and listen to music

SAFETY

HCTDA's primary concern is the safety of participants. Therefore, bicycle helmets are required, and riders are expected to obey all traffic regulations. Thanks to the Brownsburg Police and Hendricks County Sheriff Department for traffic control.

You may register the day of the ride, but the fee increases (see registration form).


T-SHIRTS

SPECIAL FEATURES OF RIDE

NEW THIS YEAR! Riders will start out "sprinting" down the world famous quarter mile drag strip at Lucas Oil Raceway. This is the home of the national drags. After exiting the raceway, all four distances will ride on the B&O Trail. The 10-mile route will cross the White Lick Creek bridge and make a U-turn on the trail. Other distances will ride to the end of the trail, exit the trail, and continue through the scenic farmlands of Hendricks County. Consider lingering a few moments at the bridge overlook to enjoy the view! As always, the B&O Bicycle Tour encourages families and novice riders, as well as experienced bicyclists, to enjoy the sport of bicycling. To make the ride family-friendly, there will be refreshment stops on all routes, even the 10-miler, and kids 12 and under are free! Each stop will feature homemade cookies, treats, and fruit, as well as plenty of water and port-o-lets. SAG vehicles will be roving the routes to assist with minor mechanical problems or fatigue. Route maps are provided by Roark Custom Titanium Bicycles.

Gear Up Cyclery will be on hand at Williams Park to answer mechanical questions and assist riders with pre-ride inspections. Riders will enjoy live music sponsored by Duke Energy as they eat a BBQ lunch from Pit Stop Barbecue and Grill (10:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.). Lunch is included with registration. At our biggest SAG stop in Maplewood, the Avon High School Jazz Band will liven up the refreshment stop with energetic music.

TOUR DESCRIPTIONS

10 miles — For beginning cyclists and families: an easy-going, flat ride; you will "sprint" down the world famous drag strip. After exiting Lucas Oil Raceway, you will travel over four miles on the B&O Trail, taking in the murals in the Ronald Reagan Parkway tunnel and the new bridge over White Lick Creek. It returns the same route. There is a refreshment stop at the Rotary shelter about halfway through the ride.

25 miles — After sprinting down the dragstrip and exiting Lucas Oil Raceway, you will ride over five miles on the B&O Trail, viewing the murals in the Ronal Reagan Parkway tunnel and the beautiful White Lick Creek bridge. You will then ride on county roads to the SAG stop at Maplewood. Enjoy refreshments and live music before your return trip through the picturesque Hendricks County countryside. You re-enter the trail at the same spot you exited and return to Lucas Oil Raceway for lunch.

45 miles — This route starts out the same as the 25-miler. After leaving the Maplewood SAG stop, continue west to the SAG stop at beautiful McCloud Nature Park, provided by the Hendricks County Parks and Rec. You will encounter a few moderate hills near McCloud. Your loop takes you back to the Maplewood SAG for a 2nd visit, then returns you to Lucas Oil Raceway for lunch via the B&O Trail.

62 miles — Similar to the 45-mile route, plus some additional miles of picturesque farmland and another SAG stop in Jamestown.

SAG STOP MUSIC

There will be live music by the Avon High School Jazz Band at the Maplewood SAG stop.

Check-in begins at 7:00 a.m. in the pavillion at Lucas Oil Raceway, 10267 US-136, Indianapolis, IN. DO NOT ENTER THE MAIN ENTRANCE ON US-136. ENTER GATE 3 FROM CR 300N approaching from the east. Registration fees support Hendricks County Trail Development Association, a non-profit group promoting the development of recreational trails in Hendricks County, specifically on the B&O Railroad corridor. 
